

## Tim Grogan

Mr. Grogan is a Harvard MBA and former CEO. He was a University Scholar and Ewing Fellow at the University of Oklahoma, from which he graduated *cum laude*. He went on to the Harvard Business School, where he was a Rockwell International Fellow and graduated with a Masters degree in finance.

He began his career as Assistant to the CFO of Helmerich & Payne, a NYSE energy company, before being recruited to Chicago as Vice President of Fuji Bank, one of the largest international banks. At Fuji, Mr. Grogan was Manager of Underwriting, where he directed a team of MBA's and CPA's in performing due diligence on 8-figure leveraged buyouts, and Portfolio Manager responsible for nearly half a billion dollars in loans.

Mr. Grogan went on to be a turnaround consultant in the Upper Midwest for nearly a decade, performing crisis management for more than 20 companies across multiple industries, including directing the bankruptcy and sale of Schwinn Bicycle Company. He was hired as CEO of Lull Corporation, a national forklift manufacturer based in Minneapolis, where he successfully returned the company to profitability and sold it to a competitor. He was then recruited to be CEO and owner of a Silicon Valley teleservices provider, where he grew the company by acquiring its largest competitor from EDS and sold it shortly before the dotcom collapse.

After serving as Executive Director of the non-profit Nature Conservancy for several years, Mr. Grogan now serves as Director of Principal Investments for Domain, where he recently directed the successful sale of four properties totaling nearly 1,000 units, and is responsible for sourcing, underwriting, and acquiring multifamily properties.
